3. Highlight of our New/Latest projects

The following key highlights featured in Child Hope Development Organization's past six months. We are grateful and feel honored to every Supporter, Volunteer, staff, and partner who in one way or another made this all happen through your Sacrificial contribution, and changes in the lives of those we are serving. Here are the highlights:

- The number of our reached-out beneficiaries grew from 700 to 1,200 this is a 58% increase!
- We grew programs to 5 schools.
- We supplied computers to 5 schools.
- We implemented School feeding programs, income generating programs, Child sponsorship program, and women empowerment programs.
- We provided medical equipments to two partner hospitals (Mawenzi Referral Hospital and St. Joseph Hospital).
- We conducted Medical rural campaigns and supplied Mosquito nets to rural families of our sponsored children.
- We implemented Environmental conservation campaigns through tree planting projects at schools.
- We continued hosting and engaging volunteers for different community development projects.
- We continued supporting and providing school uniforms, supplies, and accessories.



4. Vote of Thanks to our Supporters, Volunteers, Staff, and friends/partners

We have been blessed with incredible and hard-working supporters who have tirelessly ensured our cause is on a progressing move! Your time, support, concern, and contributions in so many ways enabled us to bring hope, happiness, and a promising future to those who needed it the most! It is on behalf of the beneficiaries we serve; that we extend our heartfelt vote of thanks all of you for your continued support and partnership.

However, we have selected one story and life experience of one of our Volunteer/Supporters /partners that we want to share on your behalf as our hero for this Semi-annual; this goes to Dorice Kivire. Dorice is our Social worker who has had the responsibilities of writing letters for children to our sponsors as well as compiling academic progress of our sponsored children and share to the sponsors. Dorice has also been involved in facilitating Women's trainings.



5. Upcoming events

The following are the key events planned to happen in the coming three months of Our ministry and service to the marginalized children and their communities in Tanzania:

- Hosting and engaging teams of Volunteers.
- Fencing project at Remiti Kindergarten school.
- Completion of the Uniforms unit at Mawenzi Hospital.
- Fundraising and Mobilizing funds for the Radio program.
- Implementing the "Grow Green, breath clean" campaign.

6.A typical Day nural Tanzanian child

“Nanyori”, a Maasai girl at the age of 8 wakes up at 5:00 am to get ready for her day. She is already enrolled at a 10-kilometer away primary school. she has to wake up early enough so as to get prepared and join other neighboring kids to the school. It takes them at least two hours to walk and arrive at the school, at around 7:00am. As they walk to school, all of them haven’t had any breakfast or take way snack to kick start their day! it is important that “Nanyori” has to join other kids to school because there are normal and reported cases of rape, dangerous animals, and other threats on the way to school.

After doing general environmental cleanliness at school, Nanyori starts her classes from 8:00 am to 3:30 pm with tea and lunch breaks in between; she with other kids (the majority of the school kids) can’t go back to their homes to make use of these lesson breaks because of the distance! But also, even if they could, most of their families can afford only one meal, a day. It is therefore better for Nanyori and friends to just stay at school and get it all done at 3:30 pm.



At 3:30 pm they start their way back home from school; after two hours of walking they say goodbye to each other as they arrive at each one's home at around 5:30 pm. Nanyori has 4 young siblings to take care of while at home; at the age of 8, she is also expected to prepare a meal for herself and her siblings. This is because her mother has possibly been away looking for the family's bread of the day! Nanyori is raised in a male-dominance culture where a mother is 100% responsible for the family's daily bread. She is normally home at 6:00 - 6:30; she expects to have found Nanyori has prepared a meal for the family, taken care of the siblings, and done other domestic assignments. This all has no room for Nanyori's time for school given homework, or revisions!

Her father having four wives with families is rarely seen at home. He never went to any schooling level, the same as Nanyori's mother, Nanyori's father's home absence doesn't bother her, she actually feels more comfortable and secured to have him not around home, this because he has been in regular quarreling with his wife over Nanyori's needed early marriage to an old friend, aged 50 who is not only considered rich (in possession of numerous cattle!) but also he has promised to change Nanyori's father poverty situation by giving him some cattle!

This all is not new to Nanyori at her age; actually, a number of her best friends at school disappeared from going to school after their fathers forced them to get married at the age of 8-9. This was important for them as it was considered helping to change their family's abject poverty situation!



At school, teachers are encouraging Maasai children like Nanyori to not drop school for early child marriages. They share and motivate them that education could be the Only weapon that can help their families fight poverty. This is what motivates Nanyori to persist, however, her future in pursuit of education and its promises is still so much in doubt and questionable.

7. Ways one could make an impactful Difference untradition way!

Each one of us could actually make a difference in someone else's life and destiny. Not all of us can make a donation, not all of us can Volunteer , and not all of us can do what is needed to be done. But ALL of us in our own unique ways and contexts have something that we would decide to do ! We, therefore , invite you to join our cause by considering doing some thing within your contexts in the form of the following:

- Share the news with friends or some one new who could be encouraged to take a step in joining our cause!
- Decide to be a voice for the voiceless, and pass on the message of hope, a future , and a better tomorrow!
